

# KINDERGARTEN CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT

A stoplight will be used to keep track of each child's daily behavior. Every student will have a clothespin with their name on it. The clothespins will start out on green each morning.

When a problem arises, students will be given verbal reminders about their behavior. If the behavior does not improve, the student will be asked to move his/her clothespin to the yellow stoplight and will take a short time out for the misbehavior.

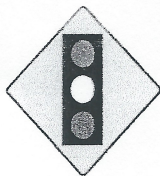
If throughout the day, another problem arises, the student will be asked to move his/her clothespin to the red stoplight and will miss a whole recess.

Misbehaviors that are dangerous such as throwing rocks, hitting, biting, etc. will result in moving clothespins straight to the red stoplight.

During the first week of school, we have been establishing and practicing our school rules. Next week, we will be implementing our stoplight. Don't be surprised if your child comes home over the next couple of weeks and has had to move his/her clothespin to the yellow or red stoplight. We are still learning our classroom rules and we will let you know if we feel there is a serious problem.

You can track your child's behavior daily by checking the monthly calendar in the back of your child's red folder. 'G' indicates green, 'Y' indicates yellow, and 'R' indicates red.
